ADOPT-A-PARK: GHSP's Fourth Visit to Hemlock Crossing Park

(Grand Haven) On June 28, thirteen GHSP employees plus one employee's daughter pulled 31 bags of Spotted Knapp Weed as part of an effort to control invasive plants at Hemlock Crossings County Park.

Spotted Knapp Weed has roots that release a poison, which is very hazardous to surrounding plants, according to Melanie Manion of Ottawa County Parks. Fortunately, the Parks team was able to identify the Spotted Knapp Weed and the GHSP team was able remove the plants.

This is GHSP's fourth trip to the park in the last two years. 2011 is the second year of GHSP's three year commitment to improving the park.
