On December 3, GHSP Grand Haven employees made 242 holiday cards and presented them to local American Legion Post Commander, David L. Mackellar, and his Service Officer, Carl Lori. These cards will bring holiday cheer to Bravo Company 1-147th Aviation Headquarters Battalion, a Michigan Army National Guard Aviation Company currently deployed in Iraq nearly half-way through their deployment.

On the same day, GHSP Hart employees made holiday cards, wreaths and decorations for soldiers serving our country in the Middle East. One hundred and ninety-eight cards, 26 wreaths decorated with candy canes, candy, and other items and 192 ornaments, a total of 14 boxes full, were sent on December 4th to three separate units, all deployed in or headed to Afghanistan.

GHSP Hart employees have ties to some soldiers stationed overseas. Of the three units receiving boxes filled with good tidings, one unit includes SSGT Kevin Stanfield, the son of GHSP employee Laurie Gatton. Another unit includes SSGT Nicole Hammerle, recommended to GHSP by a local Marine, and the third unit includes Major Eric Wilson, a GHSP employee serving with the reserves. Wilson is currently stationed in Edinburgh, Indiana, so those boxes will make their way to Afghanistan with a brief stopover in Indiana.

About 425 employees participated in this event, which in Hart included a friendly decoration competition judged by GHSP's president and engineering employees from other GHSP locations. This volunteer project is one of many the GHSP employees have participated in as part of an effort to achieve 100% volunteer rate among employees for the current year.
